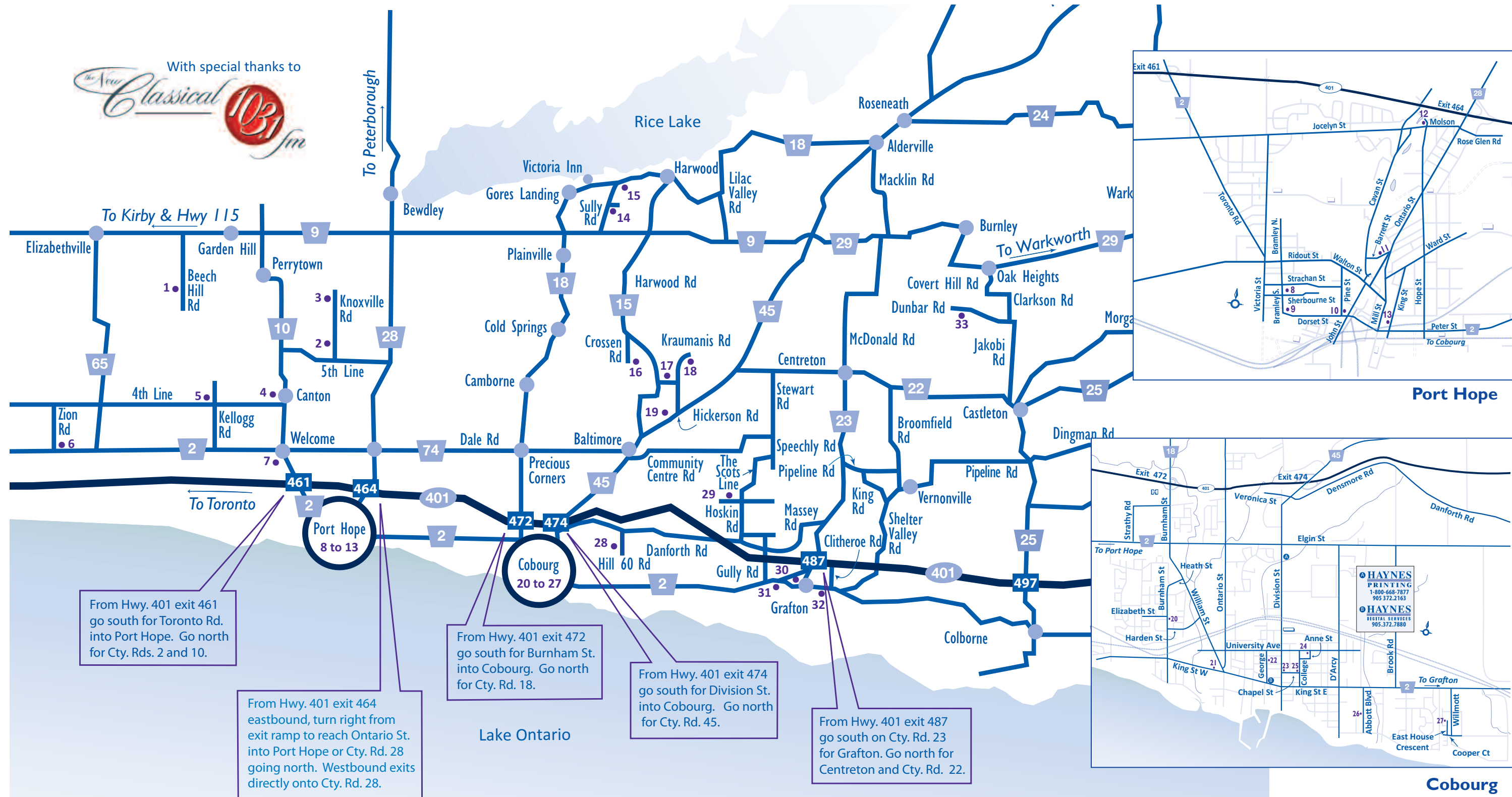
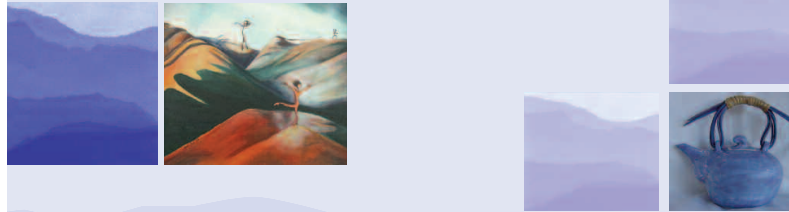

1. Elizabeth Vercoe – painter, mixed media

Colourful, expressive images on canvas and paper. Working in various media, Elizabeth employs drawing, texture and spontaneity in her pieces. Enjoy a stroll through her gardens. From Cty. Rd. 10, go west on Cty. Rd. 9 through Garden Hill, turn left (south) on Beech Hill Rd. to #7228.
